# Scales Aren't Just a Fish Thing



Each Player receives 15 cards

Five piles with two cards down and one card up in each pile.

Five cards are revealed at all times. If you put one of your cards on the center pile, turn one of the cards in your piles face up.

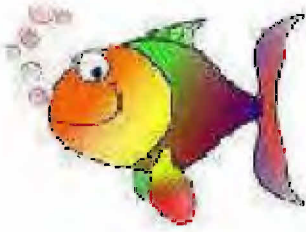
One card from each player's 'fish' is shuffled and place in a pile.

To make it even more exciting, you can place the cards in separate piles and when you want to stop the game remove one of the piles.

The first player to finish placing all their cards, slaps the table.

While the game is being played, the players watch how many cards each player has left. When a players last card is place they slap the smallest pile. If another player slaps the pile first having observed that the other player was out of cards, they win that round.

The other players have to slap a pile (the smallest pile) and incorporate all the cards from that pile into their pile.



On 'Go', all players try to put the card that is up or down from the card on the top of the pile. The cards colors reflect the color-coding for the key of C.


If the card on the top of the pile in the center is 'DO', then the next card that could be placed would be either 'Re' or 'Ti'

## Speed is critical



The object is to get your card on the pile first before another player places their card on the top.

It gets wild and crazy and forces your brain to work without thinking.



This is the goal. To know the answer without having to think about it. This is when information has been embedded and assimilated. The winner is the one who has been able to place most of their cards on the deck.
